"Community" was added to our name to emphasize that we "humans" are one element of the natural community within our greenway. We develop a "sense of place" as we become stewards of the wild spaces that surround, nourish and sustain us.

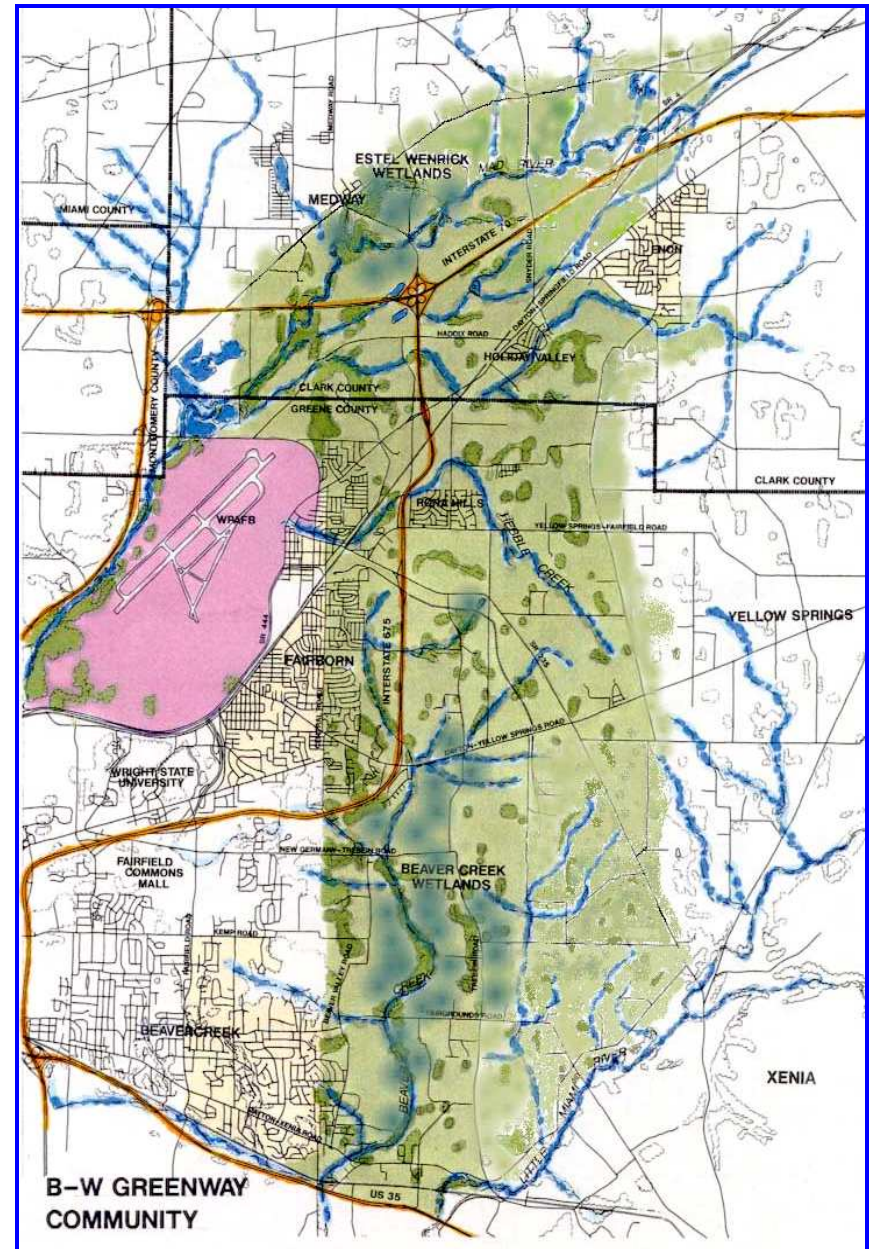

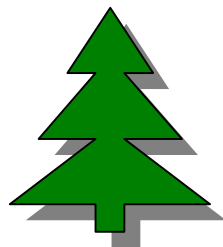

Home to more than 20 vendors, each with their unique products, you will find a variety of food, placemats, table cloths, and centerpieces for your table. Here is a taste of the numerous vendors: Double E Ostrich Farm provides a full line of ostrich products, including filet, steak patties and a variety of sausages. Summer Field Handmade Soaps, Ltd. has all natural handmade soaps and a variety of gift sets including pet products. Dohner's Maple Camp has pure maple syrup. Prefer honey? On Saturdays there is a vendor who specializes in honey, including sourwood and buckwheat honey! E.A.T. food for life is the certified organic family farm, operated by Dan & Nancy Kremer, that was previously mentioned. The sausages are delicately flavored and the asparagus is fresh and delicious. Dan and Nancy also have a variety of cheeses and produce.

The Spice Rack has a large variety of Amish products including cheeses and butter, spices in bulk, and gluten free products. In the mood for dessert? Azra's Desserts has a variety of European Pastries and there is even a person who has a variety of individual sized cheesecakes! Two vendors have artisan breads. The Savvy Local Food Shopper

Below is a list of when foods are in season in our area. If you see an item that is not in season, you can be fairly certain it was not grown locally.

One of the best ways to be sure of the source of the food is to ask the vendor. If she/he can not assure you it was grown locally, it probably was n't. It also helps to ask if any chemicals were used in the production or packaging.

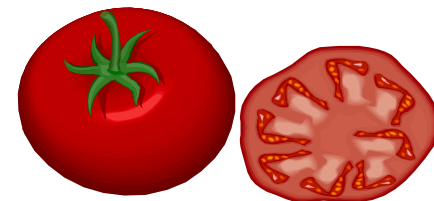
